Communique August 2024

Update

The Direct Experience Group (DEG) held its 4th formal meeting on the 19th August 2024.

Information from the meeting

The meeting was the first with a nominated member led Chairperson in place and the first with all ten membership spots filled.

The focus of the Quarterly meeting was progressing DEG'S 2024 Workplan areas:

Topic #2: **Assessment and Investigation** and Topic #3 **Accountability and Transparency**

Preparation activities prior to meeting included:

- Collating of Direct Experience Insights
- Review of Child and Young Person's Safety Ac (2017) available DCP policy and practice documents.
- Developing understanding of key problem areas and impact
- Defining change needed
- Initial development of Theory of Change

Jackie Bray, Chief Executive of the Department for Child Protection attended the group. This was the second meeting attended by Ms Bray and she reiterated that she is enthusiastic about developing relationship with DEG members, hearing directly from the group and developing open communication.

Ms Bray took a range of questions relating to the assessment and investigation processes of the Department for Child Protection. Noting that the DCP Assessment Framework DCP is not publicly available.

Questions also pertained to possible areas of improvement. Covering practice models and initiatives from interstate and international settings.

Topics included:

- Blind Assessment Model utilised in the United States, which shows results in reducing practitioner bias.
- Possibility of extending Family Group Conferencing to all children and families coming or in contact with DCP
- Funding Model and ensuring supports for children, parents and families are resourced during the assessment phase to reduce number of children in out of home care.
- Improving the information provided to parents, so complaints and FOI process is reserved for genuine complaints or FOI requests.

- Possibility of a short term live-in parental assessment centre similar to the Parent assessment and skill development services provided community residential setting model in Victoria.
- Language in legislation and the importance of proposed Bill containing language around safety and support for families.
- Questions and explanations around redacted practice documents and investigative processes.

Findings and Recommendations, regarding *Assessment and Investigation* will be presented to the Minister for Child Protection on 1st October 2024.
